Tokugawa Ieyasu built Hamamatsu Castle in 1570, and between the ages of 23 and 45, he spent seventeen years of his prime in Hamamatsu. During this period, through the many calamities he endured, such as the Battle of Mikatagahara, said to be the worst war defeat in his life, Tokugawa Ieyasu was able to gain immeasurable knowledge. Hamamatsu was the land where Tokugawa Ieyasu took his first steps in conquering the country. Hamamatsu Castle has come to be known as the Castle of Success after a number of lords of the castle in the Edo period were chosen to take up important executive positions in the shogunate, such as Roju (Elder: one of the highest-ranking government posts) and Kyoto Shoshidai (Vicegovernor of government in Kyoto). In addition, a number of sites across the city, such as Hamamatsu Castle, are gaining attention as spiritual spots.
